CLARENCE M. LONGLEY, Workers' Compensation Judge, finds, awards, and orders as follows:

JOINT FINDINGS OF FACT

(1) Cheryl Burt, born April 10, 1948, while employed as a Graphics Technician, Group 40, on September, 1988 as to Case No. ANA 0255342 and September, 1987 through September 1988 as to Case No. ANA 0255346, by Unisys Corporation, Permissibly Self-Insured, adjusted by Comco Management, sustained psychiatric injury in September, 1988.

(2) Applicant did not sustain internal injury.

(3) Applicant is not in need of treatment.

(4) Liens, self-procured, med-legal costs are to be adjusted.

- (5) All other issues are moot.
- (6) There are no funds from which to award attorney fees.

**JOINT ORDER**

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

- 1. Applicant sustained psychiatric injury in September, 1988 per Findings of Fact No. 1.
- 2. Liens, self-procured, med-legal costs are to be adjusted per Findings of Fact No. 4.

- 4. There are no funds from which to allow attorney fees per Findings of Fact No. 6.

### JOINT OPINION ON DECISION

Defendant stipulated to psychiatric injury and internal injury in the nature of hypertension is in issue.

It appears that applicant had hypertension before beginning work for this employer. Dr. Villalobos, reviewing applicant's medical history, records that applicant had a blood pressure of 150/104 on October 20, 1978. It is, thus, questionable to attribute the hypertension to the employment. Applicant's Doctor, Dr. Klein, is unable to state, with any probability, that applicant has hypertension.

As to psychiatric disability, I believe it is mild at best. Applicant has worked at every opportunity since the psychiatric episode in 1988 and the substance of both psychiatrists' reports is a mild personality disorder. I do not believe she has anxiety as stated by Dr. Frank and refuted by Dr. Wardell.
