Findings and Order

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. HELEN WELCH, born September 19, 1940, while employed as a numerical control program engineer, at Torrance, California, during the period of September 14, 1989, through September 14, 1990, by McDonnell Douglas Corporation, insured by Industrial Indemnity Company, did not sustain injury arising out of and occurring in the course of her employment citing exposure to noxious fumes and chemicals resulting in vertigo and inflammation of the 7th and 8th cranial nerves.
2. Jurisdiction is reserved regarding all outstanding liens.
3. There are no funds in which to pay attorneys fees.
4. All other issues are rendered moot.

**OPINION AND DECISION OF WORKERS'
COMPENSATION JUDGE**

Matter was heard on October 7, 1994. Both sides were present and were represented by their attorneys.

Injury Arising Out of and Occurring in the Course of Employment (AOE/COE): Based on a review of the entire file, medical-legal evidence and sub rosa films, I find that applicant's testimony was not credible, Garza vs. WCAB, 35 CCC 500.

I find that applicant failed to establish a causal link of the coolant causing her condition.

In this regard, I rely on the credible and well reasoned reports of defendant's medical consultative reports, Donald G. Leigler, M.D., orthopedic doctor and Stuart H. Mann, M.D.

Defendant's sub rosa films clearly demonstrated to me that applicant was less than candid about her purported work related disabilities.

Applicant shall take nothing by way of her applicant or claim.

Jurisdiction is reserved regarding all outstanding liens.

There are no funds in which to pay attorneys fees.

All other issues are rendered moot.
